The curriculum in the field of political science works to develop the professional skills and practical experience of faculty members through scientific cooperation agreements with relevant institutions such as provincial councils, the Human Rights Commission, or the Independent Electoral Commission.

The admission plan for the Master of Arts in Political Science program is determined based on the department's capacity. The academic committee sets the required number of new students for the upcoming cohort, according to the established admission channels (general track, private-fund track), and submits it to the college council for approval. Following this approval, it is sent to the university and then to the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research for official endorsements.

After the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research approves student admissions, which are based on a competitive selection process that considers GPA, age, competitive exam scores, and personal interview evaluations, students proceed with the official registration process by visiting
